

# The Highest Dinner Plain Self Storage

**Dinner Plain Self Storage is nestled amongst the snowgums in one of Victoria's most peaceful and friendly villages 1,520 metres above sea level and is surrounded by the Alpine National Park.**

The facility's facade has followed the original guidelines set for Dinner Plain by architect Peter McIntyre. The building's construction and use of local building materials are inspired by the characteristics of the old cattlemen's huts. Built of stone, timber and corrugated iron the facility blends in with the high plains landscape.

The construction of the facility was completed by Regis Consulting who are a specialised self-storage design and construction company. The most challenging part of the project was the material procurement and scheduling of trades for the site, however the project was completed on time for its scheduled opening that coincided with the opening of the snow season. "A number of our staff enjoyed the opening as well as being some of the first to test out the downhill runs", said Anthony Regis of Regis Consulting.

The facility is the only one of its type servicing Dinner Plain and Mt Hotham. It is located

along the Great Alpine Road and is only ten minutes drive to the Mt Hotham airport. Regular flights service the mountain from Qantas link during the ski season.

Dinner Plain is also home to the Onsen Retreat and Spa plus the ski fields of Mt Hotham are only ten kilometres away.

The market is unique as well as varied from housing skidoos, ski equipment, snow making equipment to general storage.

The skidoo shed has a unique access point with the skidoo rider being able to remotely open the electric roller door as they approach the entry ramp. James Bond would feel at home here!

The facility also incorporates a north facing, modern residence. From the residence you can watch the snow play across the road as skiers dart up and down the ski run. Cross country ski trails also feature in the foreground as they wind their way through the snowgums.

The facility also has a heated driveway for the winter months and clients are able to drive into the central internal undercover loading area.

The facility was opened Queen's Birthday weekend 2007.
